Votes:

1) Abortion and Fetal Pain (S1165): Would prohibit abortion in Idaho after 20 weeks when substantial medical evidence suggests the unborn child can feel pain. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 24-10 Sponsor: Senator Chuck Winder (R-14)

2) Obamacare Abortion Coverage (S1115): Would opt out of coverage for elective abortions under Obamacare. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 27-7

3) Expanding the Idaho Health Care Freedom Act (H0298): “Expand the Idaho Health Freedom Act to include greater protections for Idaho employers, insurers and medical providers, and 2) stop the operability of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act’s discretionary provisions while providing a verification process to protect taxpayers against the unnecessary implementation of the PPACA during fiscal year 2012.” Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed: 24-11 Sponsor: Senator Monty Pearce (R-9)

4) Medicaid Cost Containment (H0260): Constrains future growth in the cost of the state’s Medicaid program through reforms and spending reductions. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed: 27-8 Sponsor: Representative Janice McGeachin (R-32)

5) Food Stamps Fraud Prevention (H0262): Requires verification that the number of dependent children being claimed is the actual number of children which exist for food stamps. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 29-6 Sponsor: Representative Christy Perry (R-13)

6) Fraudulent Use of a Social Security Number to Obtain Public Benefits (H0230): Makes it a criminal offense to provide a fraudulent social security number to obtain public benefits. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed: 30-4

7) Education Reform: Teacher Tenure (S1108): Phases out teacher tenure for new teachers and current teachers who have not yet earned it, and limits the length of teacher contracts to one year to provide school districts with additional flexibility. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed: 20-15

8) Education Reform: Merit Pay (S1110): Creates a pay for performance plan for Idaho teachers and administrators to reward quality in education. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes: Passed 20-15

9) Education Reform: Technology (S1184): Saves tax dollars by using technology to more efficiently educate Idaho Students. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed: 20-15

10) Advertising on School Buses (S1111): Raises revenues for schools by allowing for advertising on school buses. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed 25-9 Sponsor: Senator Chuck Winder (R-14)

11) Federal Unemployment Funds (H0109): Seeks additional federal funding for state unemployment benefits, thus adding to the national debt. Idaho Conservative Position: No. Passed 24-7

12) GARVEE Bonding Authority (H0285): Provides another \$162 million in bonding authority, borrowed against future revenue to pay for highway projects. Idaho Conservative Position: No Passed 26-9

13) Public Labor Agreements (S1006): Prevents government entities from entering into public labor agreements, which shut non-union employers out of government contracts. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes. Passed 27-7 Sponsor: Senator John Goedde (R-4)

14) Union Subsidies (S1007): Forbids labor unions from subsidizing wages to help union employers win government contracts. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 25-8 Sponsor: Senator John Goedde (R-4)

15) Wolves: State of Emergency (H0343): Declares a state of disaster emergency as a result of the Canadian Wolves problem. Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 27-8

16 Closed Primaries (H0351): A bill to close the Idaho Republican Primary to respect the right of freedom of association Idaho Conservative Position: Yes Passed 28-7
